Monday 7
September 2026

Israeli Strike on Kfar Remman Kills Nine, Including Two Paramedics and a Child

An Israeli strike on a house in Kfar Remman killed eight people, including a child and two women, and injured 11 others, including four children, two women, and a paramedic from the Islamic Health Organization, according to the Ministry of Public Health's Emergency Operations Center. A separate Israeli strike on a vehicle in the same town killed a paramedic from the Al-Risala Scouts and injured two other paramedics. In total, the two attacks killed nine people and injured 13, affecting children, women, and medical personnel protected under international humanitarian law.

Israeli Strikes and Demolitions Continue Across Southern Lebanon

Israeli forces carried out, on Monday, September 7th, airstrikes, drone strikes, artillery shelling, explosions, and demolitions across southern Lebanon. Two explosions were carried out in Mansouri in the morning. Israeli warplanes later struck the town six times, while heavy artillery shelled Nabatieh al-Fawqa, and an airstrike coincided with a large explosion in Kfar Tibnit.

Further explosions and demolitions in Mansouri destroyed additional homes, with approximately two-thirds of the town's houses reportedly destroyed and the remainder rendered uninhabitable. Israeli aircraft also carried out further strikes on Nabatieh al-Fawqa and a vehicle in the al-Maslakh neighborhood of Nabatieh, while an Apache helicopter conducted a sweeping operation over Arnoun. Separate attacks included an explosion in Houla and a drone strike on the road between Soujoud and al-Rayhan.

Tuesday 8
September 2026

Israeli Forces Demolish Homes and Direct Fire Toward Residential Areas

Israeli forces carried out, on Tuesday, September 8th, airstrikes, artillery shelling, explosions, and demolitions across southern Lebanon. An explosion was carried out in Mansouri and heard across Tyre and surrounding villages. A further explosion in the town was accompanied by the bulldozing of homes.

Israeli warplanes struck the Hay al-Hariq neighborhood of Nabatieh al-Fawqa twice in less than 15 minutes. Artillery shelled Sarbin, while a separate explosion was carried out in Kfar Tibnit. An Israeli tank fired four shells toward homes on the western outskirts of Meis al-Jabal. Israeli aircraft also struck the outskirts of Qantara toward Wadi al-Slouqi and fired a missile at Bani Hayyan that reportedly failed to explode. The attacks directly affected homes and residential areas and left an unexploded munition that may continue to endanger residents.

Wednesday
9 September 2026

Israeli Forces Burn Homes and Continue Attacks Across Southern Lebanon

Israeli forces carried out, on Wednesday, September 9th, artillery shelling, explosions, fires, and drone activity across southern Lebanon. A drone dropped a sound bomb over Haris toward Hadatha. An explosion was carried out in Qantara. Artillery struck Beit Yahoun, while Israeli forces set fire to homes in the western part of Khiam. Successive explosions were also carried out in Mansouri and Wadi al-Slouqi. The burning and destruction of homes further undermined residents' ability to return safely to their communities.

Retired Military Personnel Protest Exclusion of Salary Adjustments from Draft Budget

Retired military personnel gathered, on Wednesday, September 9th, in Riad al-Solh Square and other areas to protest the absence of adjustments to ranks and salaries from the 2027 draft state budget. Protesters said that their incomes were insufficient to meet the rising cost of basic goods and demanded that the minimum wage be raised to approximately \$1,200. The protest highlighted continuing concerns regarding the right of retired public personnel to adequate and timely remuneration capable of securing a decent standard of living.

Human Rights Watch Documents Israeli Use of White Phosphorus in Southern Lebanon

Amnesty International published, on Wednesday, September 9th, an assessment of Lebanon's new Media Law, which was adopted on August 11th and published in the Official Gazette on September 3rd. The organization noted that the law introduces protections for journalists, media workers, and freedom of expression online. The law prohibits pretrial detention in media-related cases, removes military court jurisdiction, and strengthens protections for confidential sources, editorial independence, digital media, and public-interest reporting.

However, Amnesty International warned of serious gaps. The law creates a new criminal offense covering the intentional fabrication and dissemination of undefined "false or harmful news," punishable by up to three years in prison.

It also leaves several Penal Code provisions criminalizing protected speech in force and creates uncertainty over criminal penalties for defaming public officials and institutions. Amnesty International warned that these provisions may expose journalists and activists to arbitrary investigation or prosecution for exercising their right to freedom of expression.

Thursday
10 September 2026

Israeli Forces Destroy Homes and Artesian Wells in Mansouri

Israeli forces continued, on Thursday, September 10th, demolishing homes in Mansouri and carried out airstrikes on the town's Mashaa area and the valley between Mansouri and Haniyeh. They also destroyed artesian wells in Mansouri, affecting water infrastructure serving the town. Israeli warplanes separately struck Nabatieh al-Fawqa in two waves.

More than ten explosions were reported in Mansouri and its surroundings after midnight, with drones reportedly dropping barrels containing explosives onto the roofs of homes before detonating them. Israeli aircraft also struck the area between Zibqin and Shihin, while explosions were carried out in Meis al-Jabal and Bani Hayyan. Further artillery shelling affected Zawtar al-Sharqiyyeh, Wadi al-Houjair, and Wadi al-Slouqi. The destruction of homes and water infrastructure compounded the conditions preventing residents from returning and accessing essential services.

Israeli Demolition at Ali al-Taher Registers as Magnitude 4.1 Seismic Event

A large Israeli demolition at Ali al-Taher Hill on the outskirts of Nabatieh al-Fawqa generated seismic waves on Thursday, September 10th. The National Center for Geophysics, affiliated with the National Council for Scientific Research, reported that the waves were detected by all of its monitoring stations at 9:08 p.m. The United States Geological Survey registered the event at a magnitude of 4.1, with reporting indicating that it resulted from the force of the explosion rather than a separate tectonic earthquake.

Friday
11 September 2026

Israeli Attacks Target Homes, Infrastructure, and Residential Areas

Israeli forces carried out, on Friday, September 11th, airstrikes, artillery shelling, explosions, and military movements across southern Lebanon. Israeli forces moved along the northern outskirts of Meis al-Jabal, accompanied by artillery shelling that struck a house and by machine-gun fire. Two consecutive airstrikes and a large explosion targeted infrastructure and residential neighborhoods in Mansouri.

Further explosions and artillery shelling affected Mansouri and the Ali al-Taher heights on the outskirts of Nabatieh al-Fawqa. Israeli forces later demolished additional homes in Mansouri, while warplanes struck Nabatieh al-Fawqa in two waves.

Israeli Forces Destroy Most of Mansouri Public School and Block Khardali Road

Israeli forces destroyed, on Friday, September 11th, most of the public school in Mansouri, leaving only a small section of the building standing. Israeli aircraft also struck the town in conjunction with a large explosion. The destruction further damaged civilian educational infrastructure and affected the future provision of education in a town already experiencing extensive residential destruction.

The Khardali road was completely blocked by rocks and debris following the previous night's explosion at Ali al-Taher. The blockage forced a Lebanese Army bus travelling toward Marjayoun and Hasbaya to use an alternative route through the Bekaa. Israeli forces also carried out an explosion on a hill in Braasheet, while artillery shelled Wadi al-Houjair.

Saturday & Sunday
12 and 13
September 2026

Israeli Forces Target Homes and Continue Shelling Across Southern Lebanon

Israeli forces carried out, on Saturday, September 12th, demolitions, artillery shelling, explosions, and drone operations affecting homes and civilian areas across southern Lebanon. A drone dropped explosive material on several homes east of Khiam near Birket al-Hamam, causing a fire. Israeli forces also carried out large demolition operations targeting several homes in Mansouri and Ainatha.

Intense explosions continued in Mansouri, with tremors felt in Tyre and surrounding areas. Artillery also struck Doha Kfar Roummane, the outskirts of Arnoun, and Wadi al-Slouqi. The continued targeting and demolition of residential property further obstructed the safe return of residents to affected towns.

Israeli Strikes, Explosions, and Artillery Shelling Continue Across Southern Lebanon

Israeli forces carried out, on Sunday, September 13th, airstrikes, artillery shelling, and explosions across southern Lebanon. Israeli warplanes struck the vicinity of Tallet al-Dabsha on the outskirts of Nabatieh al-Fawqa twice in less than half an hour. Artillery also shelled the Ali al-Taher grove and Zawtar al-Sharqiyyeh.

In the Bint Jbeil district, artillery struck Hadatha, while large explosions were carried out in al-Tairi and Kounine.

WHERE:

City/village, governorate, additional details
(e.g. which prison)



HOW:

A narrative description of what happened



TO WHOM:

Information regarding the victim (name, nationality, gender, date of birth, city of origin, phone number). Only share this information with the consent of the person.



WHAT:

Nature of the violation



WHEN:

Date of the episode (at least the year, if day and month are unknown)



WHO

is the person reporting (name, phone number) and how were they identified (e.g., victim him/herself, family member, eyewitness, journalist, humanitarian worker...)

The information referred will remain completely private. It will be fact-checked and registered into CLDH's internal system. No action will be undertaken without the explicit and written consent of the reporter.
